This seminar traces the long history of Black Muslim politics, movements, and thought in the United States. It outlines the establishment of Black Muslim communities, politics of race and religion, gender, belonging and marginalization in order to reflect more substantively upon the impacts of "Black Muslim Reason" – the twofold reproach of Black Muslims through Islamophobic and anti-Black violence. More importantly, however, this course reviews the manner in which Black Muslims have endured in the wake of such violence and have contributed heavily to the Black Freedom Struggle.
